13.2 Approval of First Amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement with Taylor Morrison of California, LLC

In November of 2024 the Azusa Unified School District’s (“District”) Board of Education (“Board”) approved the execution of a purchase and sale agreement (“Agreement”) for the sale of the District’s surplus real property located at 1035 East Mauna Loa Avenue, City of Azusa, known as the former Powell Elementary School site (“Property”), to Taylor Morrison of California, LLC (known as “Taylor Morrison”). During its Feasibility Review Period, Taylor Morrison encountered a number of delays in receiving feedback on its predevelopment application, due to backlogs with staff at the City and a scheduled review meeting. The District’s broker has investigated to confirm that this request is justified. As such, Taylor Morrison seeks an amendment of the Agreement extending the Feasibility Review Period, to account for these unexpected delays. The District, with the assistance of its broker and legal counsel, negotiated an amendment to the Agreement to account for this extension. The First Amendment to the Purchase and Sale Agreement will amend the following terms of the Agreement: 1. The termination date of the Feasibility Review Period, as set forth in Section 2.2 of the Agreement, will be extended from February 19, 2025 to March 31, 2025. 2. A second, one time, automatic 30 day extension of the Feasibility Review Period is permitted if the City’s upcoming meeting is delayed further.

13.3 Approval of Resolution #24-25:23 Authorizing Staff to Proceed With Sale of Property (Former Mountain View Elementary School) and Making Related Findings

The Azusa Unified School District ("District") has undertaken the statutorily required process for the sale of the Former Mountain View Elementary School Site Property located at 201 N. Vernon Avenue, Azusa, California, 91702, identified by assessor's parcel number 8615-018-901 ("Property"). On August 8, 2023, the District's Board of Education ("Board") adopted a recommendation by the District's Facility Advisory (7-11) Committee to declare the Property surplus. Thereafter, the District offered the Property for sale to all required public entities pursuant to the statutory process set forth in Education Code section 17464. Upon receiving no offers from these public entities, the District requested a waiver from the State Board of Education, pursuant to Education Code sections 33050 et seq., waiving certain portions of the statutory sale of surplus property process ("Waiver"). This Waiver was approved on July 10, 2024, authorizing the District to proceed with a Request for Proposals process and allowing the District to select a buyer for the property is in the best interests of the District. On November 12, 2024, the Board approved and authorized the sale of the Property to Trumark Homes, Inc. ("Trumark Homes") through Resolution #24-25:09. Thereafter, on or about January 22, 2025, Trumark Homes terminated the agreement to buy the Property. District staff, in conjunction with its real property Broker, DCG Strategies ("DCG"), has requested and reviewed other back-up offers to purchase the Property and requested the Board to review sale of the Property to Taylor Morrison of California, LLC ("Taylor Morrison"). District staff, in consultation with legal counsel and its broker, DCG Strategies, determined that it is in the best interests of the District to sell the Property to Taylor Morrison and recommends that the Board approve the offer submitted by Taylor Morrison. District staff and legal counsel thereafter prepared the purchase and sale

agreement (“PSA”) and the notice of exemption from CEQA (“NOE”) for the sale of the Property. The District seeks to authorize appropriate District staff to proceed with all necessary processes to effectuate the intent of the Resolution.
